<b>Pruning Info:</b>							
<b>Pruning Group A:</b> These varieties flower on growth produced the previous year. Lightly prune out weak or dead stems, right after blooming is finished (May or June).							
<b>Pruning Group B1:</b> These varieties flower on wood that was hardened off from previous year's growth. This group usually consists of a heavy flush of flowers in May - June on the previous season's growth, followed by a second smaller flush of blooms in September on the							
<b>Note: If rejuvenation is needed,</b> a severe pruning can be carried out. It will reduce the number of flowers, but will not hurt the plant. Follow instructions as in Group C.
