Attracts pollinators.</b> Huge flat umbels of creamy-white flowers (May-June) are edible, can be deep fried in batter, used in baking, or added to fruit salads. Harvest large, shiny dark purple clusters of berries in Aug/Sept. Berries are tasty for jams, pie and wine. Fruit is also used in food colouring and in nutraceutical industry for it's high anti-oxident properties and vitamin content. Vigorous upright, arching shape, attractive green compound foliage. Prune to shape in early spring, or can rejuvenate older shrubs by removing 1/3 of oldest branches to ground level. Partially self-fruitful, two or more varieties are recommended for better fruit production. Plant at least 2m apart, 4-5m between hedgerows. Full sun to partial shade, rich, moist, well-drained soil.
